The Government of BC and the Chair of ICBC have recently stated their intention to look “very seriously” at capping injury claims for drivers, passengers, cyclists, and pedestrians who have been injured in a collision with an automobile. This will reduce our ability as British Columbians to be treated as individuals, and to seek out help when navigating the daunting process of an injury claim.

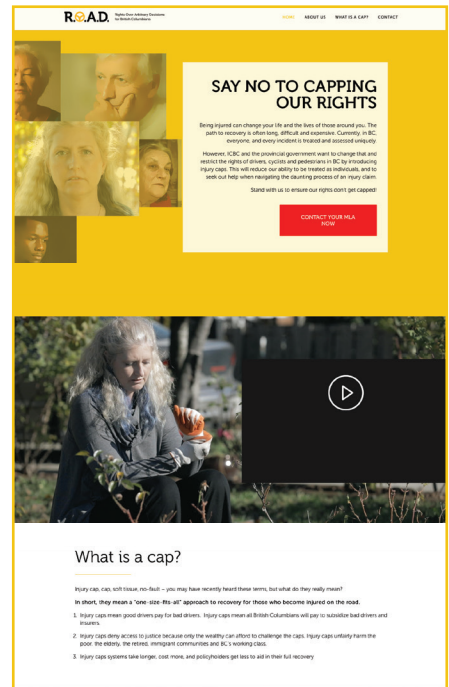
In short, injury caps mean a “one-size-fits-all” approach to recovery for those who become injured on the road. They deny access to justice because only the wealthy can afford to challenge the caps. They unfairly harm the poor, the elderly, the retired, immigrant communities and BC’s working class, as the claims awarded to victims are often far less than the true cost of their injuries. Simply put, **caps punish victims.**
